
Belarusian Amerikanka or Elections Under Dictatorship

A candid and powerful memoir by opposition politician Andrei Sannikov

In *My Story*, Andrei Sannikov, former deputy minister of foreign affairs of Belarus, recounts his journey from the top echelons of political power to the pro-democracy opposition movement, revisiting his prominent campaign as a presidential candidate and his experiences after finding himself behind bars on the day the election results were announced.

Sannikov tells of the interrogations, and physical and psychological abuse he suffered at the hands of the KGB and labor colony staff, as well as the government's persecution of his family and friends.

The book closes with Sannikov's release, juxtaposing first-hand accounts with international press coverage. This section also provides a bigger picture of why Sannikov decided to run for president, describing in frank terms the repressive political regime under longtime Belarusian leader Aleksandr Lukashenka, sometimes called "Europe's last dictator."







At the outset of the 1991 coup attempt by conservative hardliners, the leaders of the coup decreed a "temporary limit" on the publication of all central and Moscow newspapers, save for a handful of those obviously sympathetic to the putshchists. *The Coup* presents a collection of newspapers published underground during August 19-21, 1991. To our knowledge, these newspapers represent a complete collection of what was published during what has been called the "three days that shook the world."

This exceptionally rare collection consists of facsimile reprints of actual editions of these papers. The editions presented in this book are identical to the originals – there have been no deletions or additions of any kind.


The Central State Archive of the Soviet Army (now the Russian State Military Archive) contains some of the most important and sensitive documents relating to the early history of the Soviet state with some 2,000,000 documents in almost 33,000 record groups documenting the years 1917-1941 for the Soviet military.

Volume 1 contains detailed references to records on key events of the later interwar period, records from the central Soviet military organs of the entire period, and much more.

Volume 2 begins with large sections devoted to the bulk of the Archive's holdings: documents on the directorates and staffs of rifle and cavalry formations and units. Subsequent sections detail the separate and independent units of the Red Army, and the Archive's holdings on Red Army special forces, among others. This volume also includes an index of military divisions, a bibliography of all works published on the basis of the Archive's holdings, and a comprehensive subject index to the entire two-volume guidebook.
